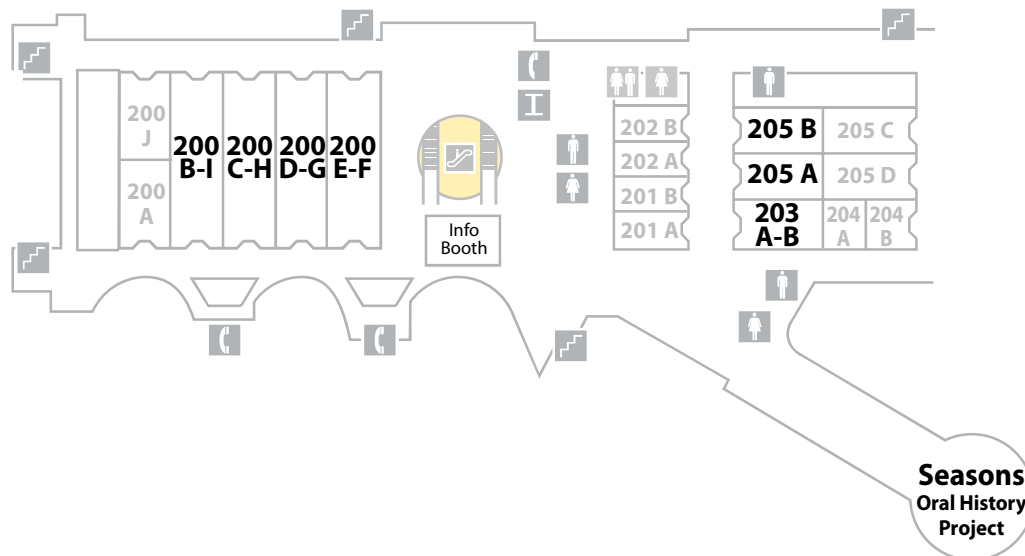

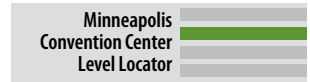

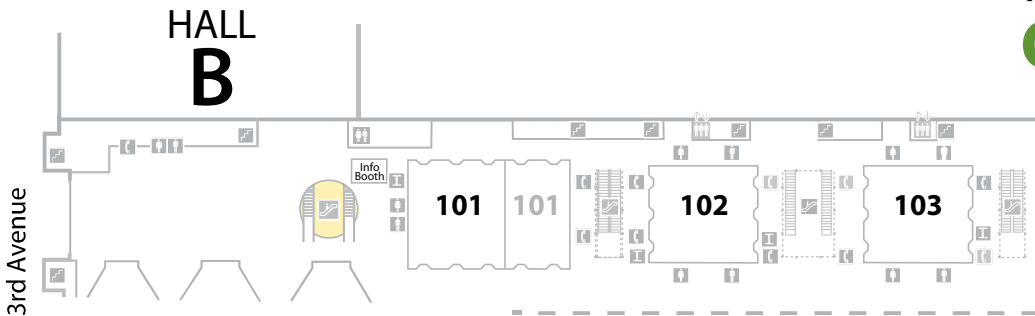

Haircuts (Room 102) – This area uses an appointment system; visit their front desk to make an appointment.

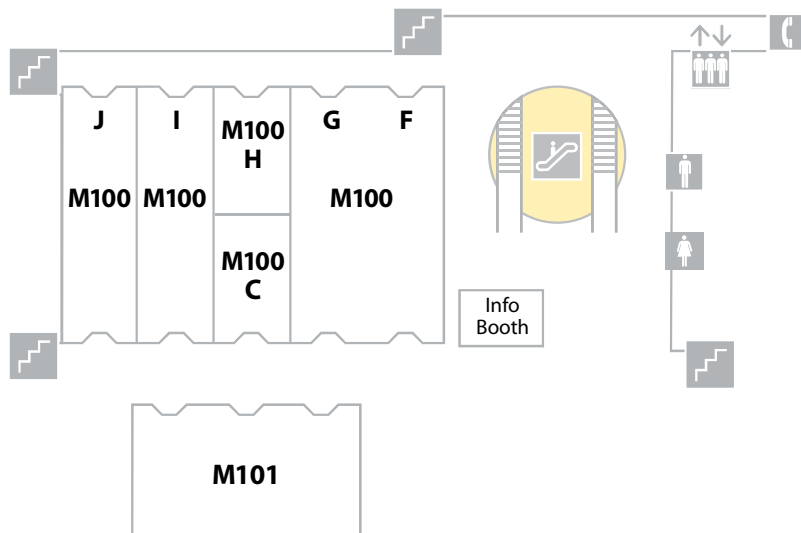
Legal (Room 103)

The Legal Section is a centralized, integrated section of approximately 90 legal providers, including: lawyers, law students, paralegals, legal administrative assistants, judges and court staff. We offer brief legal advice, brief legal service, assistance with completion of pro se forms and referrals for full representation on a wide variety of legal issues and needs, including: family law (divorce, child support, custody, OFP’s); criminal law (records information, advice re: eligibility for records expungement, warrants); housing law (landlord/tenant, mortgage foreclosure); and general civil law (consumer, government benefits, employment, contracts, conciliation court, out-of-state birth certificates).

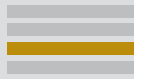

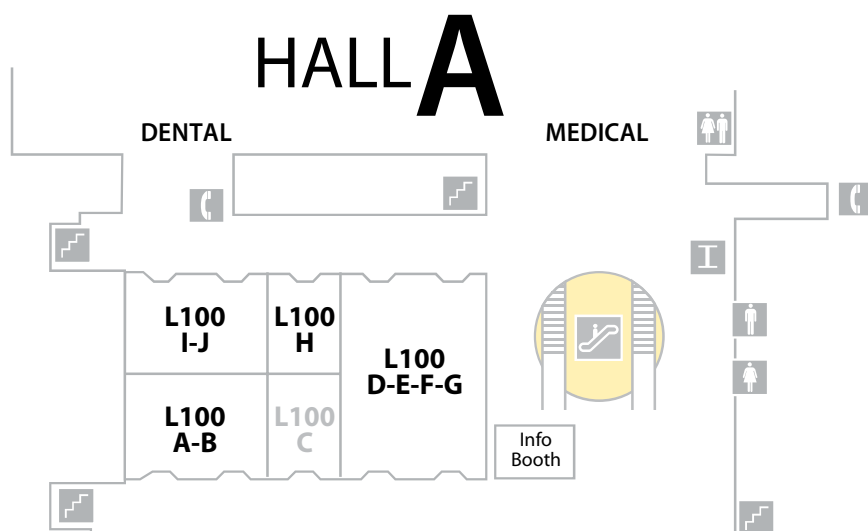

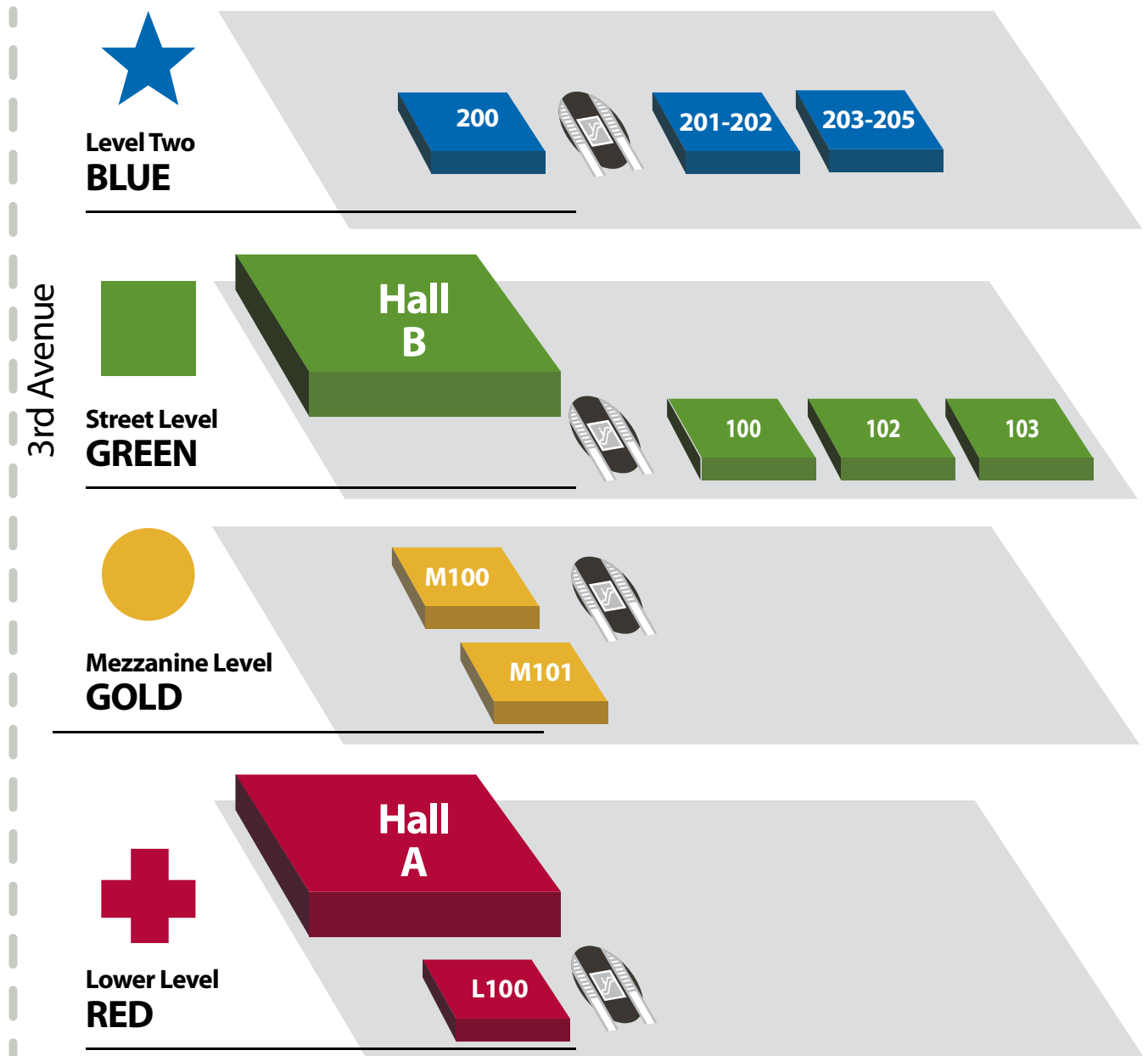
